Band Highlights and School Day Concert Information from Ms. Housten

The 4th grade band students are getting ready to present their first concert. Band #1 will be performing on Thursday, December 8th and Band #2 will be performing on Friday, December 9th. Both concerts will take place at 9:50 AM in the Village School cafeteria. Parents are welcome to attend this short, informal concert. Due to the fact that the concert will only be 15-20 minutes, there will not be any evening performance for the band in December. Evening concerts will take place in March and June.

The band students have been playing their instruments for about 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ months and have learned how to properly hold their instruments and produce a sound. They have learned 6 notes and are able to play songs and read music using these notes and simple rhythms. The students will be performing some of the songs that they have learned at the concert. Almost all of the songs that will be presented will be performed in unison, meaning that all of the students in the band will be playing the same notes at the same time. Playing in unison is the first step towards learning how to play in a group. The students have learned how to watch a conductor and to listen to each other in order to play together. The fundamental skills that the children have learned during these months will serve as a basis for all future learning and future performances.

Notes from the Health Office

We are starting to see an increase in viruses and bacterial infections. The VES Nurses would like to remind you of Health Office requests that are beneficial to your child/children, as well as the entire school community. Children should be fever free for 24 hours or in the case of a bacterial infection such as strep throat, be given an antibiotic for 24 hours before returning to school. In-



and enter through the cafeteria doors or park on the right side of the back driveway that is between the school and the traffic island. **Please do not park on the roadway itself as it creates a traffic hazard.** Students will be dismissed to the cafeteria for parent pick-up at 3:45 p.m. as instruction takes place up until this time. Parents must sign children out in the cafeteria. Send a note to your child's teacher in the morning if you plan on picking up your child in the afternoon or if your child is attending an after school activity. **Without a note, children will be sent to their buses**. Midday and end of day pickup requests can be disruptive to instruction and are difficult to honor as dismissal information is confirmed early in the day.

School Day Parking: Parents/visitors may park in our new front visitors' lot, our side lot, or our large new lot in the back between 9:30 and 3:45. When parking in the back lot, visitors will, in most cases, need to walk around VES and enter the front main entrance as all doors are locked at 9:30. Please do not park on or block roadways. If you absolutely must park on a roadway, use caution and park on the far right side. Parking is always prohibited in designated fire zones and in the bus driveway.
